The Council need to respect the walkways and enhance the environment.

③ The kerbs need to be swept weekly on McCormacks Bay Road (1.5 km) as they accumulate debris from the stormwater that becomes groundwater. There are underground springs that continuously seep over the footpaths.

Drainage from the Main Road is accumulating in McCormacks Bay. There is also clay build-up adjacent to 150 McCormacks Bay Rd from the cliff face (loess).
Note:

Pollution reaches the estuary via stormwater drains. The drains channel water from sealed surfaces to prevent flooding? build-up. If these areas are not maintained it collects toxins and rubbish ie oil, petrol from cars, dirt & dust, water from washing cars - therefore affecting the estuary.

Thank you for your letter raising concerns about the Lower Styx/Hawkins/Marshland Roads intersection.

I am advised that the Transport and City Streets Unit has engaged a consultant to carry out an initial investigation to determine if there is a common factor involved, that can be rectified.

I have asked the Transport and City Streets Unit to keep the your community centre informed of the consultant's findings and any future proposals. I understand that the "easy fix" solutions have already been implemented and it is quite possible that any further work may involve significant changes which involve lengthy design consultation and funding processes. One way to progress your proposal for funding for traffic lights is to make a submission to the Draft Annual Plan 2006 and I have enclosed a copy for you (there is a submission form on page 4).
