Ballantynes supports the proposal to extend the Tram route according to the proposal decided upon by the Council in March



April 2008

The organisation I represent, namely, J Ballantyne & Co Ltd supports the extension of the current tramway system and service to include City Mall and Oxford Terrace.

The reasons for our support are outlined below:-

1. The tram is used predominantly by tourists and visitors to the City. It makes good sense to extend this service to the pre-eminent shopping and hospitality precinct of Christchurch.
2. It makes sense to do this whilst council is renovating City Mall into a world class inner City precinct and to put in place the rail base while this work takes place.
3. It will probably lead to greater patronage of the tram for those wanting to get about the City.
4. There is a great deal of capital investment planned for the inner City over the next decade and included in this is the greater Christchurch Urban Strategy and the advent of greater inner City living and facilities.

Collectively these will change the face of the inner City and its uses.

We see the tram extension as part of this strategy.
