

## Holiday Inn City Centre

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We are very supportive of the extension both to the Tramway and the Java Café reserve area.

Extending the Tramway out to Manchester Street via Cashel Street and returning back on High Street has many positive linkages for the City. Particularly it provides an important tourist link to the High Street area and the “Lanes” revitalisation, which is currently a City focus.

However we wish to submit that:

- i. It is important for the Holiday Inn City Centre’s operation that the current coach park outside the hotel’s front door is maintained. As we are a major city hotel we obviously have many guests that we have to unload and load their luggage to get them in and out of the hotel. The current coach park works well and is vital for our business.
- ii. We would like to see provisions for the current taxi stand and loading zones on the East side of Cashel Street retained. These provide an important service to this area.
- iii. We support the tram extension being on the east bound traffic lane of Cashel Street as shown in the drawings. This assists in providing the bus parking and taxi stands referred to in (i) and (ii) above.
- iv. Relocating the angle parking to the northeastern face of High Street is not a preference. Currently we have plans to remodel our frontage of the hotel (including the shops) significantly and would prefer to see the angle carpark remain on the southwestern edge of the street. We would also be against the angle parking being removed entirely from this portion of High Street.
