Residents' Groups

What is a residents' group?

Residents' groups exist to provide support and assistance to their neighbourhood. They have a common purpose and set out to achieve a common goal. They may be set up to provide recreation activities, eg playgroups, or in response to a perceived threat to the stability or character of a neighbourhood, eg saving an historic building. Their primary purpose is to provide a focus for the needs and aspirations of the residents of an area.

Maps detailing the areas covered by existing residents' groups, together with contact names, are shown on pages **21 to 28**.

Residents' groups formation and recognition

- The Christchurch City Council encourages the formation of local residents' groups.
- 2. Local residents' groups are able to apply to their Community Board for recognition as an 'official' residents' group for their area.
- 3. Residents' group boundaries within each community are determined by the appropriate Community Board.
- 4. Such groups, upon recognition, receive the right to be consulted by the Council on all work planned within their boundaries.
- 5. The Council provides free typing and photocopying for official residents' groups, within limits approved by the Advocacy Team.
