

Prepare and implement a landscape plan to restore the significance of the historic 1898 Barker planting as colonial 'show place' for the distinctive Garden City style, especially as seen from Madras Street. Consider extending the parkland by removing part of the Cambridge Terrace roadway and reducing the size of the turning area. This area has potential as commemorative theme area based around the Christchurch Beautifying Association and is a suitable setting for an artwork

Prepare and implement a conservation plan that will retain the listed notable poplars lining the river and replace other ageing Lombardy and black poplars with new Lombardy poplars. Remove all other trees that encroach on the poplar vista as seen from Manchester and Madras Street bridges. Consider adding further lighting of the trees. Keep the existing indigenous riverbank vegetation

Improve this pathway

Establish a new pedestrian and cyclist crossing

The Lombardy poplars are notable trees listed in the City Plan P Populus nigra "Italica"

Review the locations and types of commemorative trees and plaques in this area.

Keep the existing green link between the river and the business district through this park

Prepare a conservation plan that will retain the listed notable poplars lining the river and the listed historic objects and will improve their Garden City setting especially as seen from Madras St. This area has potential as a commemorative theme area celebrating the Christchurch Garden City image

Relocate recently planted magnolias

Review and upgrade the pedestrian and cycling link across Madras Street and alongside Oxford Tce
