The purpose of this report is to report back to the Board on Neighbourhood Week 2001 in the Shirley/Papanui wards.

Neighbourhood Week took place over the week 27 October to 2 November 2001. Approximately 200 Neighbourhood Week packs were sent to Neighbourhood Support Co-ordinators, Residents groups and interested parties in the Shirley and Papanui wards. This pack contained an a Neighbourhood Week poster, an application form and letter explaining the Board's offer of funding, a colouring competition, the 'Capturing a Cruise caption competition' pamphlet, the 'If Teens Ruled the World' competition pamphlet, a letter from Neighbourhood Support New Zealand Inc., a letter from New Zealand Police, Neighbourhood Week Walks information and advertising material.

The Board allocated \$3000 towards Neighbourhood Week 2001. The following is the breakdown of costs incurred as at January 2002.

NEIGHBOURHOOD EVENTS

COLOURING COMPETITION
