The purpose of this report is to inform the Community Board on progress on Parks and Waterways Capital Projects within the Board area as at 20 June 2002.

## **OVERVIEW**

Included with this report is a schedule setting out details in respect to individual capital projects. Overall progress throughout the year was satisfactory, however a significant number of projects throughout the city are still being held up awaiting consents. Those specific to this Board area are noted in the status column on the attachment. A small number of projects have not yet been completed due either to hold-ups in design or consultation. Most of these are now under way and funding has been carried forward to 2002/03 to cover this work.

The most pleasing aspect of the year's programme was the high level of participation in the consultation process for many of our projects and the innovative approaches by all those involved in creating worthwhile and sustainable projects. Without the hard work of our Parks and Waterways Area Advocates and the support of the elected members, this could not have happened.
