

8. TREE PLANTING

The purpose of this report is to request funding for a proposal to plant trees on the frontage of properties in one street (one in each ward area), where street trees are unable to be planted.

PROPOSAL

A suggestion has been made by a Board member to consider a proposal to plant trees on the frontage of properties in lower socio-economic areas where there are very few trees and where, due to the width of the footpath, it is not possible to have street trees.

A suggested project title is "Greening up our Suburbs" and this could be carried out in partnership with Housing New Zealand and a local nursery.

Local school children could take part in the planting and use could be made of the opportunity to educate the children about their local environment as well as their being involved in a community project.

The project has been discussed with a Parks and Waterways Arborist, who would be prepared to become involved in this project if required.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

It is a known fact that the planting of trees helps in minimising the effects of CO₂ emissions. This will be promoted as part of the programme.

Staff**Recommendation:**

1. Allocate \$5,000 from its 2002/03 Discretionary Funds towards the project, being \$2,500 for each ward; or
2. Allocate \$5,000 from the \$7,000 already allocated for street trees in its 2002/03 Project Funds towards the project, being \$2,500 for each ward.
