4. PEOPLE + PLACES + SPACES: A DESIGN GUIDE FOR URBAN NEW ZEALAND

The purpose of this report is to inform the Committee about a recent Ministry for the Environment publication and an associated urban design workshop.

BACKGROUND

In May 2001 the Ministry for Environment appointed consultants to prepare an Urban Design guide for New Zealand. A discussion group was held in Christchurch in August 2001, to which a cross section of professionals in the field were invited. These included staff from the City Council, Ecan and Lincoln University, local consultant architects, surveyors and developers. Feedback was also given to the authors from a group of Council Officers who debated the draft document.

The design guide was launched by Marian Hobbs, Minister for the Environment in March 2002. A workshop to familiarise people with the use of the guide was held in Christchurch in April 2002, which was attended by a number of Council staff, the chair of this Committee, a Community Board member and local landscape architects, architects, engineers, surveyors and other professionals.

THE PURPOSE OF THE GUIDE

The purpose of the guide is "to give all people interested in more liveable and prosperous urban areas – professionals, Councillors, business people and the wider community – a taste of what urban design is, and how to achieve better urban design. Urban design aims to make our towns and cities more economically prosperous, socially inclusive and environmentally friendly, while also making them look and work better for people". The guide provides a broad overview of urban design processes and principles that are appropriate for New Zealand. The guide explains that processes need to be community-led, place-based, design-informed, multi-disciplinary and where appropriate, a partnership between the public and private sectors. People+Places+Spaces, A Design Guide for Urban New Zealand is available from the MfE at a price of \$15.

THE WORKSHOP

The workshop, run by Kobus Mentz a Consultant Urban Designer and co-author of the report, was held to enable participants to become familiar with and explore, the issues, process and design principles set out in People+Places+Spaces. Some local case studies were reviewed in the context of the guide, a hands-on design session was held and there was a discussion on the perspectives of community groups, professionals, developers and councils. The workshop outcome was "to provide a better understanding of sustainable urbanism issues and practices".
