11. BERESFORD STREET: PARKING RESTRICTION

The purpose of this report is to seek the Board's approval for the installation of a "P5 Loading Zone Goods Vehicle Only" restriction on the north side of Beresford Street west of Oram Avenue.

A recent change to the use of the former Deka building in Beresford Street has meant that the P60 parking restriction outside this building is no longer appropriate. This building is now being used by the "\$2 dollar" retail business as an office and distribution centre. Goods vehicles have difficulty in finding a free parking space close to the building to load and unload their goods. At present vehicles are double parking on the street or parking on the footpath to deliver goods and are creating congestion for pedestrians and road users in this area.

To improve the safety in this area, it is considered appropriate to install a Loading Zone for Goods Vehicles Only parking restriction. The Parking Operations Manager is agreeable to these changes.

This report meets the Community Board's Objective 6 for 2001/02.

Recommendation:

That the Board approve the following parking restriction changes:

- That the P60 parking restriction on the northern side of Beresford Street, commencing at a point 35 metres from the western boundary of Oram Avenue and extending in a westerly direction for a distance of 55 metres, be revoked.
- 2. That the parking of vehicles be restricted to a maximum period of 60 minutes on the northern side of Beresford Street, commencing at a point 35 metres from the western boundary of Oram Avenue and extending in a westerly direction for a distance of 46 metres.
- 3. That a "P5 Loading Zone Goods Vehicles Only" parking restriction be installed on the northern side of Beresford Street, commencing at a point 81 metres from the western boundary of Oram Avenue and extending in a westerly direction for distance of 9 metres.

Chairperson's Recommendation:

That the abovementioned recommendation be adopted.
