

## 9. NEIGHBOURHOOD WEEK - JOINT COMMITTEE

The purpose of this report is to inform Community Boards of the decisions from each Community Board regarding continuation of the Joint Committee and membership.

At last months meetings the Boards decided as follows:

- **Shirley/Papanui**

The Joint Committee to be retained.

*Representatives:* Yvonne Palmer and Dennis Hills (Robin Booth alternate).

That the terms of reference of the Joint Committee be reviewed to define the Committee's role, funding and responsibilities. That successful initiatives citywide be included in publicity for next year's Neighbourhood Week. That future Neighbourhood Weeks be held well prior to Christmas.

- **Fendalton/Waimairi**

Rather than continuing with the Joint Board Committee, each Board pursue its own Neighbourhood Week initiatives; and that the unit responsible be requested to ensure that any citywide promotional campaign be co-ordinated as a prelude to the 2002 event.

- **Burwood/Pegasus**

That the Board recommend the Neighbourhood Week Joint Board Committee be retained.

*Representatives:* Glenda Burt and Caroline Kellaway.

That the terms of reference of the Joint Committee be reviewed to define the Committee's role, funding and responsibilities. That successful initiatives citywide be included in publicity for next year's Neighbourhood Week. That future Neighbourhood Weeks be held well prior to Christmas.

- **Hagley/Ferrymead**

The Board resolved not to appoint two representatives to the Joint Board committee. Rather, to support local initiatives from groups who may wish to run events in their community's timeframe.

- **Riccarton/Wigram**

That new terms of reference be developed.

*Representatives:* Mike Mora and Neville Bennett.

- **Spreydon/Heathcote**

That the terms of reference be reviewed to define the Committee's role, funding and responsibilities. *Representatives:* Sue Wells and Sonia Gill.

Neighbourhood Week is now being recognised as a national event. This has come about through Neighbourhood Support New Zealand, which now holds the database of Neighbourhood Support groups previously administered by the New Zealand Police. The first national Neighbourhood Week is to be held October/November 2002.
