

9. REDESIGNING RESOURCES CONFERENCE CHRISTCHURCH 7–9 JULY 2002

The purpose of this report is to seek the Council's direction on its participation in the Redesigning Resources Conference.

The inaugural Redesigning Resources Conference was held in Christchurch in 2000, with Paul Hawken and Ray Anderson from the United States and the Prime Minister, Rt Hon Helen Clark, as keynote speakers and a significant number of Councillors and staff both from Christchurch and elsewhere attending.

The follow-up Redesigning Resources Conference will be held in Christchurch on 7-9 July 2002. Continuing the successful theme started in 2000, the objective of this conference is to bring sustainability into mainstream thinking and decision making in an action focused way. The Council and its existing partners (Orion, Recovered Materials Foundation, Manaaki Whenua Landcare Research, The Warehouse, Snowy Peak/Untouched World, Macpac and Shire of Yarra Ranges, Australia) will again be highlighted as case study organisations working to improve the way they operate. Advice will be sought both from conference participants in structured and professionally facilitated workshop sessions and from a New Zealand Business Council for Sustainable Development (NZBCSD) Review Panel. The panel will consist of Stephen Tindall (chair NZBCSD), Dr Rodger Spiller (Executive Director NZBCSD), Dr Andy Pearce (CEO Landcare Research) and Peter Griffiths (Managing Director, BP Oil NZ). A number of new case study organisations will also be joining as partners, extending the ability of the Council to influence others in the City a partnership model.

In addition to the facilitated workshop sessions, the following keynote speakers will address the conference:

- Tahu Potiki – Chief Executive Officer – Te Rūnanga o Ngāi Tahu
- Dr Nick Marsh – Director Strategic Foresight, Australasia

As a conference sponsor the Council has been allocated eight "free" places at the conference. It is proposed that four elected members attend.

The Council needs to consider which elected members could best represent it at this important step in the journey towards Christchurch becoming a showcase example of a good place to live.
