The purpose of this report is to present a detailed Implementation Plan to the Board, developed from the Fendalton / Waimairi Leisure Parks and Waterways Area study (Plan **circulated separately** to Board Members).

CONTEXT

The Area Study was presented to Board members at a seminar earlier this year. From there, the Board appointed members to join a staff/Community Board working party to report back on priorities and prepare a detailed implementation plan.

The working party, attended by Board members Yiyi Ku, Val Carter and Sally Buck and staff from both the Parks and Waterways and Leisure Units, met three times to prepare the Implementation Plan.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

A detailed plan has been prepared by the working party to implement the recommendations of the Leisure, Parks and Waterways study. Most of the recommendations can be implemented within existing budgets and programmes. A few key projects that have been identified as important, currently lack funding.

It was noted that the recommendations of the study align well with the Board's objectives. Results of the study are also reflective of the Annual Residents Survey results and are influencing development of the Citywide Planting Strategy. Analysis of the latest census data has just been undertaken. Implications of the demographics on Leisure, Parks and Waterways provision are summarised in the **attached** table.

(b) Current provision, gaps and priorities

The working party examined current capital works programmes and recreation provision to investigate the opportunities within existing budgets to implement the recommendations of the study. Current provision and plans are well on track to meet many of the recommendations of the study. However, some of the projects could be approached in a slightly different way from the traditional approach in order to achieve the desired outcomes.

(c) Implementation Plan

Comments from the Working Party and a detailed Implementation Plan have been circulated separately. It is intended to report on the plan biannually to check progress on the identified actions.
