

## 8. NAYLAND STREET: PARKING RESTRICTION P10

The purpose of this report is to seek the Board's approval to alter the parking restrictions on the eastern side of Nayland Street south of Wakefield Avenue, Sumner (see attachment).

### BACKGROUND

The Village Grape Wine Shop in Nayland Street has requested that consideration be given to changing the P60 parking restriction in front of its shop to a P10 time limit. This would provide motorist's with short-term parking in this area. The type of retail businesses that operate in this area include: a health and herb shop, butcher, food bar, hairdressers, takeaways/restaurants and a wine shop.

### CONCLUSION

The shop owners affected by this change have agreed with the need for some short term parking in this area, with the exception of the hairdresser, who is on the other side of the road. The provision of some short-term parking would be of benefit to the majority of retail businesses at this intersection and the remaining P60 parking spaces in the area would continue to provide for the longer term parking requirements.

The Parking Operations Manager is agreeable to the proposed parking restriction change.

### Staff

**Recommendation:** That the Board approve the following parking restriction changes:

1. That the parking of vehicles restricted to a maximum period of 60 minutes on the eastern side of Nayland Street commencing at a point 26 metres from its intersection with Wakefield Avenue and extending in an southerly direction for a distance of 13 metres be revoked.
2. That the parking of vehicles be restricted to a maximum period of 10 minutes "at all times" on the eastern side of Nayland Street commencing at a point 26 metres from its intersection with Wakefield Avenue and extending in an southerly direction for a distance of 13 metres.
