The purpose of this report is to advise the Board of the proposed use of the remaining funds in the Shirley/Papanui Community Sport Fund.

BACKGROUND

Sport and Recreation New Zealand (SPARC) is the body that has taken over from the Hillary Commission and have advised the Council that they will no longer be contributing resources to the Hillary Commission Community Sport Fund. The Shirley/Papanui Community Board Funding committee still have funds remaining and Council has recommended that this Funding Committee do a second round, as the monies will have to be dispersed by 31 December 2002.

Shirley/Papanui Ward has \$38,456.912 remaining in the Hillary Commission Community Sport Development Fund. To make this fair and equitable I would like to recommend the following:

- 1. Shirley/Papanui do a second round of funding.
- 2. Use existing guidelines and current application forms.
- 3. Groups that received funding in the first round, would be eligible only if the application is for a completely different priority/project and that it would be an addition to their first application.
