

16. NEIGHBOURHOOD WEEK 2002

The purpose of this report is to inform the Community Board of the growth and changes of Neighbourhood Week and offer recommendations regarding the future support of this annual community event.

The Neighbourhood Week Joint Board committee met on 25 November 2002 to debrief local Neighbourhood Week activities and revisit the future structure and resourcing of the event as it continues to grow in popularity throughout the city and surrounding districts (report attached). There has also been a positive nationwide response, thanks to the support and enthusiasm of Neighbourhood Support New Zealand. The nature and purpose of Neighbourhood Week offers the wider community opportunities to collectively work towards strengthening communities at a local level. It is important to the continued success of this initiative that these relationships are fostered and maintained.

The role of the Neighbourhood Week Joint Board committee is to promote the concept of the week, and act as the interface between local communities through the Community Boards, council staff and interest groups in the wider community eg Neighbourhood Support and Safer Christchurch. The Joint committee also offers a forum for the sharing of ideas that others may wish to adopt. It is important that each Board area maintains its local autonomy and control is kept at a community level rather than be lost in the hype and bureaucracy of large-scale metropolitan events. The joint committee has indicated a need to maintain some cohesion in generic promotion and information to the public and council staff working in different areas and continue to provide a positive forum for the interest groups, and local Community Boards.

The Board allocated between \$2,500 and \$3,000 towards activities. This included promotion and advertising costs. Yvonne Palmer and Dennis Hills reported that there has been positive feedback and increased participation from diverse groups in the community doing different things such as hiring a skip to clean up the rubbish in the local neighbourhood. The Children's Day event at the Groynes was a success and has proven to be a positive start to the Neighbourhood Week activities in the district.
