4. INSTALLATION OF POSTER BOLLARDS

The purpose of this report is to seek the Board's approval for the placement of the cylindrical bollards on legal roads. These bollards will be supplied and installed by Phantom Bill Stickers Ltd in accordance with the agreement entered into with the Council.

BACKGROUND

The city has 50 cylindrical postal bollards built over the last 15 years, and in April 2002 the Council entered into a formal agreement with Phantom Bill Stickers Ltd to replace these bollards with the company's new bollards, and the construction of an additional 50 bollards by December 2005. The new design is as shown in the application attached. The attachments show the bollards superimposed onto the existing road space.

At the October 2002 Council meeting the company was given approval for the replacement of 32 bollards in the central city area, and has now applied for an additional 27 sites. Two applications are in the Spreydon/Heathcote area. These are:

- (1) LR1 Lincoln Road
- (2) LR2 Lincoln Road

Assessments of their suitability have been carried out by City Streets and the Urban Design Team. The matters taken into account were:

- Vehicle traffic safety
- Pedestrian movements
- Access issue with relation to property
- Utility services
- Effect on businesses, eg door entrance, window displays
- Sensitive environments, eg riverbank, historic buildings, etc

Staff

Recommendation: The staff are satisfied with these two applications and recommend their

approval, subject to the company approaching the adjacent property owners

and occupiers on these proposals.

Chairman's

Comment: I am concerned that these large bollards may not be in keeping with small

suburban shopping centres.
