RECREATION AND ARTS TEAM MISSION AND OBJECTIVES

Mission

To enhance the quality of life of individuals and communities in Christchurch by:

- Raising awareness of the value of recreation and arts as an integral part of daily life.
- 2. Providing/facilitating accessible and meaningful opportunities for participation by all.

Ultimately

Enhancing the health and well being of Christchurch residents and contributing to Christchurch as a great place in which to live, work and play.

PLANNING FOR 2002/2003 YEAR

When planning activities and services to be delivered, the Recreation and Arts Team considers the following information.

- 1. Council policies which are relevant to the area.
- Council and Community Board objectives
- 3. Metropolitan and local research
- 4. Networks and knowledge of local area.
- 5. Available resources funding, staffing etc.

From this a plan for each Community Board area is prepared, outlining what is to be provided or facilitated over the 12 month period. Our aim is to ensure equitable provision (ie: access for every member of the community to recreation opportunities) and to fill gaps, either by direct provision or by partnering with other agencies.

PARTNERSHIPS

The Recreation and Arts Team actively seeks partnerships in local communities. The Team's approach is to empower and resource local community groups to provide recreation opportunities for their own communities. Therefore the Team enters many grant or contract partnerships to ensure this happens. Part of this relationship may also be providing advice and support to the group to ensure safe, quality programmes are provided. Where no local providers are available the Team will directly provide programmes to ensure that communities do not "miss out".

OTHER

The Community Recreation Advisor provided ongoing advisory and funding assistance to local groups and community organisations during this time. The Leisure, Parks and Waterways study for Hagley/Ferrymead is a major piece of research which was commissioned to identify and assess issues and needs. Once completed this information will assist Council staff and the Board to make planning and funding decisions. A programme to support talented young swimmers from the greater Woolston area was developed. A working party was established to forward the proposed aquatic leisure facility in the Linwood area and there was extensive consultation and action to improve the image and increase the positive usage of Linwood Park.

FUNDING

The partnership between the Leisure Unit and the Board enabled a total of \$113,050 to be invested in the Hagley and Ferrymead wards (\$55,450 from Leisure, \$57,600 from the Board).

COMMENTS

Working collaboratively across the Council, government agencies and community organisations enables greater input and opportunities for participation by residents in a wide range of active and creative leisure pursuits which increases individual and community well-being. Links are created between people, community organisations and resources and bonds are formed creating strong networks that assist and complement each other.

FUTURE AREAS OF FOCUS FOR RECREATION AND ARTS

- Decreasing levels of physical activity and impacts on health
- Ageing population
- Lack of volunteers and impact on sport/recreation clubs
- Decreasing child/youth participation in physical activity
- Increasing ethnic minorities
- Increased demand for local, low cost recreation opportunities
- Increased demand for creative expression opportunities

CONCLUSION

The programmes, events and activities facilitated or provided in the Hagley and Ferrymead wards over the 2002/23 financial year have contributed significantly to enhancing the quality of life of local residents and communities in the area.
