



Re Reduced Public Access to Nunweek Park

Attention Joanna Walton Consultation Leader, Capital Programme Group

As the joint owner with my wife to the property at 4 Talisker Place we feel that we must make the following submissions regarding the denial of access to portions of Nunweek Park to the general public. Nunweek Park is a well used facility by the general public and any denial of access to a public amenity must be strongly opposed. The park has all manner of sporting codes using its facilities and the fencing off and denial of access to all but a few members of one sporting code is a completely wrong. While we can accept that the sport could be dangerous to the general public if the area is not enclosed the Hockey Association is prioritizing itself in having 18% of the total Nunweek Park area. Already the Hockey Association has complete authority over the area already fenced and this is just a further denial to the general public who's rates have developed and maintained this area.

- 1. As our property would be the closest to the whole hockey complex the noise and light interference from an expanded facility would detract from our properties value and affect any resale. To have a further 8 unsightly light towers would destroy an already delightful park area and the trees to the north of the property shield the unsightly stands and high perimeter fence. While we have not been at our property during the peak winter months, when the lighting would be at its peak useage, the times that it have been used while we have been at the property does create a problem. A further 8 lighting towers would create a greater light pool that will affect the other occupants.
- 2. The loss of trees along the northern boundary would also make the current facilities far more visible on an all ready busy road. The Council have not maintain the trees properly on the park boundary closest to our property and we feel that there should be no loss of trees, but a more active programme be adopted to keep the trees within the park to a reasonable height and use natures landscape to soften the impact of an already unsightly complex.
- 3. The addition of a 2.4m high fence plus additional high ends will convert an area that is quite eye pleasing into a visual high security detention type facility. This is not

what a public park with trees and grassed areas should be turned into and it would be a travesty of justice if the Council allowed the Hockey Association to proceed.

- 4 Already the security fence that is in place at the western and southern boundary takes over from the area that is leased by the Hockey Association restricting the walkway around this area and creating in the winter an extremely treacherous walking track. While it is understood that this area is to be landscaped and improved it is just another area that has been allowed to deteriorate as the current facilities hide this part of the park and it has been neglected.
- 5. The parking facilities are inadequate already and further expansion of the hockey grounds can only make the situation worse. The road is currently quite narrow and when cyclists and cars are moving along Woolridges Road they are confronting a dangerous situation. If there is greater areas providing for increased usage it will not be long before a fatality or severe accident will occurr.

Both my wife and I are extremely concerned at this new proposal and will vigorously oppose any extension to the present facilities. Christchurch is famous for its large green areas, beautiful trees and freedom for its citizens to exercise and enjoy these facilities. They must not be closed off to a few individuals to enjoy their recreation denying others their right to enjoy this beautiful park. The creation of high security fences denies the ratepayers a marvelous facility and destroys the feeling of open space for all.





On the back of the success of the Black Sticks Men's and Women's teams throughout the 2011 year Canterbury Hockey needs to be growing our sport in our community, primarily targeting children and youth.
However a deterrent to helping with this growth is the time slots that these age groups are asked to play in. The "youth" grades are not particularly not enticing as they are at later time slots on Friday's, Saturday's and Sundays and for some of us, particularly in my catchment area, the trip home is a hazardous one at the best of times at the moment being "Easties!!". No one wants to be getting their teenagers home late from sport on a Sunday night!!
As a result of a shortage of turfs several of the grades have had to have their playing times shortened to be able to fit the weekly matches in, we have been restricted as clubs as to training options so that all grades may play. Let's face it who really wants to start a practice at 9.00pm? How may other sports face this each week?
Our representative teams are also severely restricted for training times and spaces which in the long term does affect the strength of the game in our province.
With limited playing times available on only three turfs we cannot grow our sport in any of the age groups or grades, Primary or Seniors. As a parent of a nearly 9 year old and coach the 8.00am time slots are killersplus the fight to get training times for our juniors at a respectable time to take into account that trip back East.


As the president of the University Hockey Club I am involved with large number of young Hockey players and university students. To us the Hockey turf is somewhere to play and practice to be active and relieve the stress from studying.

A third turf would mean better practice and game times currently we have shortened games and practices that may end later than 10.30pm. A third turf would allow more space to practice at a reasonable time and have games finishing earlier.

As part of scheduling and administrating a hockey club I know we need a minimum of five turfs to give people a proper chance to play hockey in Christchurch. We only have three one of which has limitations on the hours it can be used. We are already late in starting and if the turf is not accepted straight away we will have another season of only just finishing games at 10.30pm which puts people off playing and having fun as they need to get up and work in the morning.

This is an issue to us as some of our teams involve a large number of 18-19 year olds who are unfamiliar with Christchurch, who do not have vehicles and rely on cycling and buses for transport. Effectively we have at young girls in a poorly lit dark environment regularly every week either waiting for rides or walking to a bus stop at 10.30-11pm at night. From a safety aspect it is beneficial to our young girls to finish earlier so they can cycle and bus home safely.

I realize that there may be some impact on neighbors one of the students who plays in my club lives in one of the closest possible houses to the park. He lives there with his whole family and when I asked him and his family about the new park his exact comments were:



"A little concerned with congestion as a whole, of more people and more cars, though kind of in both camps because I would like more hockey fields so we can get adequate training times and game time, but a third turf would make less park space. However overall would like a third turf."


I think it will be better for the neighbours as games will not go as late neither will practises so the park will be able to turn the lights off earlier and cars and people making noise will leave earlier than they have in the past eight years I have been involved.

Having been involved with Nunweek for years I can see that it is only since the earthquake that there have been any traffic issues. I admit that it is very annoying to see the sides of the streets near the park crowded with cars as businesses have moved out to the surrounding area. This however has little if anything to do with the turf. We use the turf after work hours so these cars are gone.


There has been grass games on the same field that will be turned into a turf so there is no increase in traffic on Saturday afternoons and these games have always had enough parking (this being the busiest time of turf use) so we can already tell that there is enough car parking and that the parks green space was already in use for hockey.

I see the third turf as reducing the very late night lights and sounds coming from the park while helping A large community group try to get a little bit more normal activities without having to be up dangerously late.

As a civil engineer the only action that i see that needs to be taken is the widening of entry of the hockey car park to allow better flow in and out of the turf so there is little congestion on the road.

The damaged Porritt Park fields must be replaced as soon as possible. The hockey fields are amongst Christchurch's most well utilized sports facilities running from early morning until late in the evening for many months of the year. This is necessary to allow players already involved in the sport to remain engaged. Hockey is achieving very good International results and is likely to drive even further involvement in the sport and this should not be curtailed by a lack of available facilities Nunweek Park has shown good ground structure through the earthquakes making it a suitable location to place a high cost and time consuming to replace sports fields that hockey turfs are on it. There also is the advantage that the supporting facilities such as changing rooms and toilets are already available. The car park would need to be upgraded but currently is not very well designed with large amounts of unused space and an inefficient point of entry and exit. These issues would be relatively easy to resolve by utilizing the grassed areas between the current carparks. With a single point of entry and a separate point of exit the flow could dramatically be improved enhancing both flow rates and safety. When I first lived opposite Nunweek Park it was around ¼ of its current size. I have watched it grow in size and usage to become a sporting hub for the wider Christchurch community and I believe the extra hockey field is another vital step necessary in its growth. 

My submission is written from the perspective of a person involved with 89 secondary school boys playing hockey for Christ's College in Canterbury Hockey Association grade competitions, all on artificial surfaces.

Hockey is building a strong profile as a winter sport at which NZ is internationally competitive and respected. When one looks at the National Blacksticks men's and women's sides I am disappointed to see so few Canterbury names, despite Canterbury being the powerhouse of NZ hockey for decades. This is not entirely due to the recent earthquakes, but the loss of Porritt Park has been catastrophic, and has left Canterbury hockey barely making do. It is a huge tribute to the dedication and professionalism of the those running hockey in Canterbury, that hockey has carried on. This was only possible due to the provision of a second turf at Nunweek and luckily, the St. Bede's College turf being undamaged.

If there is the opportunity to build a third turf at Nunweek Park, it must be done now, in preparation for the 2012 season.

I strongly support the view that the CCC should support the building of a third artificial turf at Nunweek Park.

As a hockey player, coach and parent I have over two decades of personal experience of the frustrations of a lack of artificial turf facilities in Christchurch and while this started to be addressed with the completion of the Marist-St Bedes turf in 2010 to bring the city's quota up to four, the sport was significantly set back by the destruction of Porritt Park in September 2010.

Christchurch has a proud tradition of success in hockey and more registered hockey players than any other city other than Auckland and yet can only currently "boast" three full sized astroturfs. I look on with envy at much smaller cities like Timaru, Dunedin, Nelson etc. with their multiple turfs and their comparatively tiny player numbers and marvel at how easy it must be to schedule suitable practise and playing times for children, to play full length games, to allow teams to develop full field skills and strategies and to even have more than three minutes warm up time on the turf before a match!

Having joined the ranks of hockey parents in the last few years I am heartened by the huge number of children playing hockey and the wonderful job most of the clubs in Christchurch do in fostering and developing the games. I am sure this is only being enhanced by the current high profile and success of our national men's and women's Blacksticks and one would expect future success will only increase junior numbers.

The big problem is how to accommodate these player numbers and how to retain the young players who will quickly wary of cramped training facilities and inhospitable times for playing and training with the limited facilities Christchurch has. As the coach of a high school hockey team I have seen first-hand the toll playing on frozen turf at 8:00am on a bitter July morning has on the motivation of teenagers to keep playing hockey when there are so many other options available. I believe a sport is only as strong as its grass roots and it is these younger, lower grade players who usually suffer the worst times and lack of facilities and so are at greatest risk of falling by the wayside, diminishing the player base and weakening the sport's potential.

A third turf at Nunweek Park will go someway to help guarantee the future of Canterbury Hockey and address







If it wasn't for the use of third party – public and private facilities we simply would be unable to accommodate the current base.


The turfs at Nunweek and Marist Park were planned to rebalance this – but the loss of Porritt has put us back behind where we need to be.

The council needs to support – both financially and more importantly in terms of expediting the process the creation of an additional turf at Nunweek.



I was a trustee of the Waimairi Artificial Surface Project (WASP) for some years until the Trust's assets were transferred to the Canterbury Hockey Foundation, now the Canterbury Artificial Surfaces Trust (CAST). WASP was responsible for the establishment of the Nunweek Park hockey facility. This submission is made in support of Canterbury Hockey being granted a lease on land at Nunweek Park for the establishment of a third artificial turf.

Following the loss of the use of the two artificial turfs at Porritt Park due to earthquake damage there has been a drastic shortage of artificial turf availability in Christchurch. Scheduled matches take up a large part of the turf time available, with some games being played at very unsatisfactory late evening times, especially in mid winter when the damp surface can start to freeze. The turf availability for essential training is also severely restricted, which impacts on the standard and quality of hockey.


I understand that some neighbouring residents have lodged objections to the granting of the lease with their main concerns relating to the increased traffic flow on Wooldridge Road and resultant safety issues that arise.

This is not a new issue and was a matter of concern when there was only one turf at Nunweek Park. WASP used to receive complaints from parents of young children about the parking congestion and narrowness of the road. Whilst the Council have made some efforts to mitigate the problems with off street parking, central zones, etc, the underlying problem is that Wooldridge Road is long overdue for widening and upgrading, given the volume of traffic it now carries. The whole of Nunweek Park has considerable sporting activity, not just the hockey facility.


The traffic issues are long overdue for urgent Council attention, and should not stand in the way of a lease for additional land on which to construct a third artificial hockey turf.

Prior to the first earthquake in September 2010, Canterbury Hockey had the use of 4 full sized Hockey turfs. The September earthquake ruined two of these fields. We were fortunate enough to have one new field prior to the start of the 2011 season.

Having just the three fields last year meant that many of our competition games were reduced from 35 min halves to 30 minutes. Competition games started at 7.50am on a Saturday morning and 8.00am on a Sunday morning. We had games that started as late as 9.10pm on a Friday night. Some games in the Secondary School mid week competition were not able to be played due to "no turf available".


As far as I am aware, no other sport in Canterbury has competitions operating under these conditions.

We would very much like to promote our sport, but due to the shortage of field time, there is no room to accommodate any further teams.


Our biggest need now is to replace the two International standard water turfs lost at Porrit Park, however we realise that this will be a longer process, in the meantime we are desperate for at least one more turf before the start of next season if we are going to be able to carry our sport through next season.

Everyone says that one of the best ways to combat the stress that the Canterbury residents have been going through for the last 18 months is to be involved in sport. We would like to be able to do this without our sport adding to our stress due to the hours at which we can play.

I do not wish to ignore the concerns of the neighbouring community, but Hockey as been played at Nunweek Park for many years and once the new International Turfs are established then the pressure should come off Nunweek Park. In the meantime, this new field is an absolute necessity for a sport that has produced some world class athletes from the Canterbury region.



- Any potential risks arising from the building of a third turf will be outweighed by the community benefits gained from having healthier and happier people who have a sense of belonging to a hockey team, and a commitment to remaining in Christchurch (of which an important part is being able to see a future here ,which includes playing hockey).

Some grades had shortened game times so that all games could be played each week. This was fine for 2011 but not for the long term.
Establishing the new turf, under such difficult conditions this year was fantastic for the players. Playing hockey is such a stress reliever that I'm sure it kept many of us sane this year. But it will be hard to maintain the player base without another turf.
It is also important to consider redeveloping the existing car park. It currently wastes a lot of space.
Hockey has been an important part of my life for 50+ years, it keeps me fit, I'm continually developing new skills, it is a fantastic social sport and I still love the game. So please allow this new turf development to go ahead in time for the new season in 2012.


To whom it may concern



After the loss of our premier turfs at Porritt Park earlier this year, we as players and coaches have struggled for consistent turf times not only for playing but also training.
The junior teams I am involved with had to train on a small turf at Sydenham park which although not completely reined by events of February 22 nd certainly is well below expectation of what we would expect were in previous seasons we had trained at Porritt
This problem of available turf also meant our junior teams had to play on a $1/8$ sized practice turf at Hornby which really is not ideal for the development of our younger players, as opposed to playing on a $\frac{1}{2}$ turf at one of our venues .The scheduling times of our games also meant that on game day our game could be anywhere from 7.45 am through to 1.45 pm. Although we are all great full that the CHA could manager to fit most teams in it is very difficult for many families to manage the time spread.
As a player playing in the midweek competition, turf availability was also a concern meaning there was no training time suitable for many team and on game day, start times would vary from as early as 6.00 pm or as late as 8.40 pm,(and not finishing 10.00pm) Although once again we are all appreciative of being allocated game time, the scheduling of these time, especially for the early games meant many team members struggle to be available for the 6.00 pm, especially with the compounded rush hour traffic issues that Christchurch faced this year.
As a hockey community it is vital that we have access to additional turf to easy playing congestion and also have slightly less parameters around playing times. The growth of hockey in the coming years is also a very important factor with both out Men's and Womens National teams excelling in our sport and hopefully will be medal contenders at next year's Olympics. It is critical moving forward that we have the capacity to cater for the growing needs of our children in our community, especially given the life changing experience many have been through in the last 15 months.

Nunweek Park being the home of Hockey in Canterbury is the logical location for additional turf and will complement the facilities that are already established at this venue. As a hockey community we desperately require the CCC to get behind this submission and support our future generation with additional turf. The addition of a third turf at Numweek Park would be fantastic and we should all work together to ensure that this can happen before the next winter season.



Christchurch is in desperate need of another hockey turf to help maintain existing playing numbers, let alone grow the game of hockey in Christchurch. The existing situation sees teams having to practice very late at night as they cannot acquire turf time at any other time. And even when they get their practice time they have to share the turf with up to three other teams at a time. The scheduling of games is very problematic due to the shortage of turf space and again teams can find themselves playing at very unsociable times because of it. Hockey is presently experiencing huge success at a national level and it would be a travesty if Canterbury Hockey Association (CHA) cannot build on this success in Christchurch. In my opinion, lack of turf space is the biggest hindrance to being able to grow the game. Lack of turf space also impacts on the quality of hockey players that Canterbury is producing. CHA is presently reviewing the competition structure to help develop higher quality players, but they will be hamstrung if they do not have the additional turf space which is integral to changing the competition structure.

Placing a new turf at Nunweek Park is the obvious place for a new turf. Firstly there is plenty of space (providing the City Council agrees to the lease) and having all the turfs in a centralised area is very convenient to the hockey community. The recent seismic events in Christchurch endorse the suitability of the land for a turf also. It is conveniently located to CHA and there are facilities (changing rooms, toilets, grandstand) already located at Nunweek Park.

The new turf needs to be in place for the 2012 hockey season. CHA has been severely depleted by loosing Porritt Park and while this turf won't be at the standard needed for international hockey, it will see the turf numbers available in Christchurch restored to pre-quake levels. I believe (and I'm sure CHA will be able to confirm this) that having three turfs at Nunweek Park will again allow Christchurch to hold national hockey tournaments.

The Christchurch hockey community cannot wait until turfs of international standing are built in Christchurch as this is realistically going to be another 5 years ago. Interim measures have been made for the Crusaders at Addington Park, and I believe similar measures need to be made for hockey.

The requirement for a fourth turf in the Canterbury area was highlighted prior to the September earthquake, with games starting as early as 8am and finishing as late as 11.00pm at night, an extra turf would have made the game times more workable not just for the players but also for the locals in the area. If we have the time and space available we can finish at earlier times which will remove noise from the areas affected.

As for competition planning the extra turf will allow more flexibility to the schools and clubs in the case of cancellations etc. At present there is simply not enough playable hours in the week to achieve this with timeslots so booked up. Even the representative trainings mean someone else is missing out.

Having the third turf at Nunweek centralises the bulk of the hockey played in our competition and would offer a superior venue for national competitions ranging from schools nationals to off season masters.


The organisational advantages would be significant as far as grounds maintenance goes with a co-located area easier to manage and no need for separate staffing at a remote site.

The older values of yesteryear for our code could be re-established garnering greater buy in from our younger players.

Turf hurt these values by developing a play and run philosophy. We need our younger players to watch hockey as well as play so there development can be accentuated.

The developmental aspects are huge as well with more training slots available to clubs and schools and having it all co-located means groups can bulk book a set time slot allowing back up players to transverse to the appropriate field as weekly needs dictate.

With careful forethought and planning we can minimise the impact in the area while still gaining the huge benefits of this project. We can work with the local community to minimise impact while creating a positive vibe to enhance the area.





Not because of cost - Because of availability.




Along with all major sports in Christchurch, Canterbury Hockey has suffered immensely with the loss of Porritt Park and the sport is not be able to deliver programmes that will enable the sport to be competitive with other Associations in New Zealand. Hockey is now played on artificial surfaces and the sport has over a number of years struggled to provide their stakeholders with sufficient time to practise and competitions are modified to suit the demand. This lack of services was overcome in 2011 due to the patience of players and parents and officials, however the sport will lose players if training times are late at night during the winter and competitions start too early and finish too late.

A third turf at Nunweek Park will assist the sport in holding players and providing suitable training and playing times until such time as Porritt Park is relocated and replaced. The proposed turf is only wet dressed, not water and that has Canterbury at a huge disadvantage.





We have lived in Wooldridge Road for the past 16 years and appreciate the rural nature of this area.

We strongly object to the proposed third hockey turf mainly for:

- 1. Traffic Congestion we have great difficulty driving out our entrance at many times because of the increased traffic on the street after the recent earthquakes and also because of the increased number of vehicles parked really close to our entrance when sporting events are on. Another hockey turf will only make this worse as there are not enough car-parks provided at this stage. The providing of 15 more car-parks by Canterbury Hockey will not solve the problem, they must think parking is a problem or they would not be offering to do this. We even have some cars parked on our property when sport is on. With the proposed changes by the NZTA to Wairakei Road access to Russley Road, traffic is being encouraged to use Wooldridge Road so this will only make things worse.
- 2. We find the noise from the hockey nights is quite loud in spite of our double glazing regarded as necessary for the airport noise as part of our resource consent to build and the loudspeaker, especially on Sunday mornings from 8am is very loud.
- 3. The hockey turfs with fencing and light poles that are there now look a bit like a POW camp and we can only imagine having a third turf with the existing trees removed and replaced by shrubs and large light towers will only make it look more so. Why do we have to give up our beautiful park to these eyesores? No-one is allowed to subdivide their land round here for any purpose but it seems the park can be carved up at the Council's will. What happens when Canterbury Hockey decides that three turfs are not enough and and decide to add more? Will they be able to apply for this too?

Nunweek Park is used by many people at this southern end for walking, running, picnicking, kite flying, cricket hits, soccer, touch rugby informally etc and that is in the area where this proposed hockey turf is to go. We are very against this proposal as it is just another example of one sector of our society being able to affect so many other people negatively. Is this the start of other sports/organisations being able to claim they need to fence off parts of our parks for their own interests?

While we sympathise with Canterbury Hockey on losing their facilities at Porritt Park in the earthquake we, as local residents and actively involved with athletics in Canterbury, have a few issues regarding the proposal to add a third hockey ground at Nunweek Park. Our concerns are as follows:

1.

Restricted use of approximately 20% of the park. Looking at the site plan it looks obvious that once the third field is created that a fence will be erected around the whole area rather than the individual fields being fenced as they currently are. Either way the access around the outside of the leased area appears to be limited. As regular users of the park for walking, running and training a group of runners we currently enjoy being able to navigate easily through and around the car park and outside the leased area with added access to the small reserve that is linked behind the hockey ground that comes through to Wairakei Road. This circuit creates approximately 2.5km of good running which could well be reduced to just 2km if access to this area is restricted or difficult. It also removes a good portion of the shaded running area.

2.

The existing car parking will not service increased activity at the hockey ground, especially as there is limited good parking on Wooldridges Road so cars will begin parking in Talisker Place and Skydale Drive which is narrow anyway. There are a number of young children who live in the area and with cars parking on both sides of Skydale Drive leaving only a narrow passage to get through there will be a danger to pedestrians, especially children. We live in St Clair Close so have experienced the carking of park users when Touch Rugby is on with cars parking both sides of the road and in some cases on the roundabouts and restricting residents access to their homes. 3.

It is disappointing to read that 22 trees will be lost and replaced with lights and shrubs. Currently there are a number of trees marked with pink dot. If these are the ones to go it would be a significant loss to the park. 4

We read in the Press last week that Canterbury Hockey seem to be of the opinion that the laying of this third field is a forgone conclusion and it was stated that a fourth field was to follow immediately afterwards. Your submission information states "This third, and last, lit artificial" so what is the real situation?

5.

One of the disadvantages to the public and local residents is that once the hockey turf is in place the fencing it excludes all other park users. It seems very sad that as a local resident we will be excluded from using using a significant section of the park. In Hagley Park at least the netball courts are still available for use by the public when games are not being played. The same with Soccer, Rugby and this was the case at QEII for athletics before the quakes. In our view excluding people from significant areas of public space is contradicatory .

It appears totally unreasonable for Canterbury Hockey to be pushing hard to gain control over a public facility that has many regular users. They aren't the only sport that has been affected by the earthquake and as stated we are part of the Athletics Canterbury community that you'll be aware lost not only the all weather

track at QE11 but the all weather no. 2 track behind the stadium as well as equipment. At present we have to commute regularly to Timaru with no assistance from the sport or government for increased costs or compete at the new base of Rawhiti Domain which is a grass track of slightly better than average quaility. Not only did we lose the facilities at QE11 but there were also two grass tracks at the University that have been lost due to the University building on these fields so that's another two training grounds gone. The University Oval grass track was the best grass track in Canterbury as well. In our opinion Canterbury Hockey should be looking at a longer term solution to find a suitable location that is currently not being used.

Proposed New Lease Area for Third Hockey Turf- Nunweek Park.

I am opposed to the council granting a ground lease to the Canterbury Artificial Surfaces Trust to develop a third **lit artificial surface hockey turf.**

- 1. There are currently two fields that operate from early morning to late at night on up to 7 days per week. In this residential and green park setting I believe that a third will be excessive. The grounds already generate considerable noise and bright light adjacent to the developed residential area of Skydale Drive.
- 2. The proposal allows for activity from 8am to 10pm up to 7 days per week.. The noise generated from this third field could be excessive. We argue that adequate consideration is not being given to rate-paying residents who are nearby.
- 3. The proposal allows for 8 lighting towers. Although it is stated that there are controls related to light spill and glare. There are already lighting towers associated with the other two fields. The amount of light emanating from the third field will add to this extensive day/night lighting across this whole area and into houses in the subdivision.
- 4. Building this field will involve the removal of both green space and amenity trees in this space. The galvanised towers and high fences are no substitute for the natural park amenity.
- 5. The field is being constructed very close to Woolridge Road and this presents traffic safety issues where cars often exceed the speed limit of 50 km. When there are primary after school sports events on Nunweek Park, the roadsides are packed with cars, and the hockey carparks are fully occupied. When the new field is erected I am concerned about access to and from the carpark, and children having to walk along Woolridge Road to access the fields.
- 6. Access through the park will be impeded by the field.
- 7. According to a recent Press statement, the Canterbury Artificial Surfaces
 Trust will quickly move to develop another 4th field on the space adjacent
 to Skydale Drive.
- 8. In summary I have concerns about the consenting of this facility based on the:
 - o number of fields
 - excessive sound generated 7 days per week
 - excessive light levels into late evening
 - removal of amenity trees and green space replaced by unsightly fences and lighting stands
 - o reduced access for walkers and joggers across the park

- o impeded access through the park for walkers and joggers
- o precedent in granting this 3rd consent for the development of a 4th field adjacent to housing on Skydale.
