The Environmental Policy and Planning Manager reported progress on the following matters:

## The Committee **agreed**:

- 1. That the Heritage Sub-Committee be given power to make a recommendation to the Council in respect of the future of the Octagonal Building, Jubilee Home (Group 3 building).
- 2. That the Heritage Sub-Committee consider the reconstruction of an early Canterbury footbridge across the Avon River linking the Provincial Chambers with that of Bellamy's Building.
- 3. That priority be given to the completion of a city-wide planting strategy document for completion by March 1999.
- 4. That the basis for a city-wide planting strategy be:
  - to integrate present Council initiatives with each other and private initiatives
  - to have a common vision for enhancing the 'Garden City' and ways of achieving it
  - to establish objective criteria for selecting the most appropriate plant for the site conditions
  - to ensure a representative cross-section of vegetation which reflects both the underlying soils and the overlaying cultural layers
  - to protect and enhance indigenous vegetation remnants, especially where they form core habitats for wildlife
  - to provide a framework of agreed principles within which individual Units, Community Boards and community groups can use as a basis for planting design.
