9. CORRESPONDENCE

9.1 BUS SHELTER – MARRINER STREET AND WAKEFIELD AVENUE, SUMNER

The Board considered a letter received from Mr B R Hansen advising that he had submitted the Council's proposed plan for the new bus shelter at the corner of Marriner Street and Wakefield Avenue, Sumner, to the annual meeting of the Sumner Senior Citizen's Friendly Club. The letter advised that the Friendly club would be forwarding a letter on this matter.

This further letter from Mrs Lola Bouckoms, Secretary of the Sumner Senior Citizens Club, was also considered. This letter asked that the Council reconsider the plan for the proposed bus shelter because of concerns that it would not provide adequate protection in adverse weather from rain and cold wind.

The Board **received** the information.

9.2 WOOLSTON PARK BOWLING CLUB

The Board considered a letter from the Woolston Park Bowling Club seeking funding for a Millennium Bowling Tournament to commence at midnight on 1 January 2000.

The Board **decided** to refer this application to the Year 2000 Projects Fund Subcommittee for consideration.

9.3 SUMNER-REDCLIFFS NETBALL CLUB INC

The Board considered a letter from the Sumner-Redcliffs Netball Club Inc seeking funding of \$500 from the Board's Discretionary Fund as a top up to the funding already received from Hillary Commission funds.

The Board **decided** to decline this request for additional funding.

(Erin Baker asked that her vote against this decision be recorded).

9.4 CLOSURE OF LINWOOD AVENUE CYCLEWAY BETWEEN HARGOOD AND TILFORD STREETS

The Board considered a letter from Mr Paul Larkin of Linwood Avenue advocating the closure of the cycleway and footpath along the outfall drain between Linwood Park and the Hargood Street/Keighleys Road corner.

The Board **decided** that a meeting be arranged between the Chairman, the Community Advocate, the Police and residents to discuss this matter.
