## 31. APPLICATIONS FOR DISCRETIONARY FUNDING

31.1 **Te Ro-opu Tamahine** – The Board had previously considered verbal submissions seeking funding which were presented on behalf of Te Ro-opu Tamahine. Te Ro-opu Tamahine comes under the umbrella of the Girl Guides and operates an after school programme for girls aged between 5 and 10 years old in targeted under-resourced communities. Life skills in a safe and encouraging environment are offered to girls who are socially disadvantaged because of their home situation.

The Board considered a detailed report seeking the allocation of funding from the 1998/99 Discretionary Funds and funding from the 1999/2000 Project Funds to ensure ongoing support in the year 2000.

The Board **resolved** that a grant of \$1,500 be made to Te Ro-opu Tamahine from the Board's 1998/99 Discretionary Fund.

Liz McRostie requested that her vote against this resolution be recorded.

31.2 **Sumner Swimming Club** – The Board considered a letter seeking funding support of \$1,440 in support of the employment by the Club of a paid Life Guard at the Sumner swimming pool. The Board had also heard verbal submissions from a deputation in support of this funding application.

The Board **resolved** to refer this request to the forthcoming Project Fund meeting.

31.3 **Sumner Residents' Association** – The Board considered a letter seeking funding of \$710 to enable the Sumner Residents' Association to place a memorial plaque to the late Stan Rule on the Boer War stone fountain, near Cave Rock, Sumner.

The Board **resolved** to make a grant of \$510 to the Sumner Residents' Association towards the memorial plaque for the late Stan Rule from its 1998/99 Discretionary Fund.

Liz McRostie requested that her vote against this resolution be recorded.
