PART C – REPORT ON DELEGATED DECISIONS TAKEN BY THE BOARD

1. STATEMENT OF BOARD OBJECTIVES AND PERFORMANCE INDICATORS 1999/00

The Board **resolved** to approve the following Board objectives and performance indicators for 1999/00:

1. To advocate for the Riccarton/Wigram community

- 1.1 To represent community concerns to other agencies, eg Council, Regional Council and Central Government, within community agreed timeframes.
- 1.2 By monitoring Council committee activities on a monthly basis to assess the impact of Council decisions on our local community.

2. To develop and maintain dialogue with the Riccarton/Wigram community

- 2.1 Hold two meetings per year involving representatives of all official residents groups.
- 2.2 Attend Riccarton and Hornby liaison meetings at least five times per year.
- 2.3 Provide monthly opportunities for public participation in Board committee meetings.
- 2.4 Hold one public meeting to invite participation in the annual plan process.
- 2.5 Hold at lest one public meeting per year per ward to seek community views.
- 2.6 Attend at least two school cluster meetings.

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3. To promote a healthy Riccarton/Wigram community

- 3.1 Provide \$3,000 to assist at least six community programmes which are targetted to the promotion of healthy lifestyles.
- 3.2 A 5% increase in participation in activity programmes in the community.

4. To use the Strengthening Community Action Plan to promote a safer community in Riccarton/Wigram

- 4.1 Monitor the implementation by way of six monthly reviews.
- 4.2 Maintain at least five different community representatives on the core group.

5. To promote a greater understanding in the community of the Riccarton/Wigram Community Board

5.1 Three bi-monthly information pages via community newspaper, and review this December 1999.

6. To implement the outcomes of existing research which addresses the social well-being needs in the Riccarton/Wigram community.

- 6.1 Implement at least the top two priorities identified in the following research:
 - Upper Riccarton
 - Youth
 - Broomfield Hei Hei
 - Out of School Care
- 6.2 Consider the findings of the Asian Youth Research Project

7. Promote and improve cultural awareness and understanding within the Riccarton/Wigram area

- 7.1 Establish local contact through the Ethnic Council and Refugee and Migrant Forum and similar groups.
- 7.2 Assist in the provision of at least one community cultural event.

8. To improve the natural and built neighbourhood environment in Riccarton/Wigram

8.1 Meet with appropriate business units of Council and Canterbury Regional Council on an annual basis to discuss issues of mutual interest and concern.

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- 8.2 Advocate for increased funding for the implementation of Neighbourhood Improvement Plans and Local Area Traffic Management Schemes.
- 8.3 Meet, at least once, with Christchurch City Council business units and Canterbury Regional Council to discuss issues of natural resources (eg air, water) as they affect the Board area.
- 8.4 Enhance the streetscape environment by initiating at least six street tree planting programmes.
- 8.5 Address the (identified) shortfall in green open spaces in the Riccarton ward.
- 8.6 Continue a programme of park enhancement, eg by placement of active/recreational equipment and/or landscaping improvements.
