

5. CANTERBURY REGIONAL COUNCIL - PARTICIPATION WITH CANTERBURY WASTE SUBCOMMITTEE

The Canterbury Regional Council had proposed an alternative to the membership of the proposed joint working party to develop integrated hazardous waste management strategies. The Regional Council's proposal was that each member Council of the Canterbury Waste Subcommittee be represented on the working party.

The Mackenzie District Council had recommended an amendment to the resolution of the Subcommittee to the effect that the membership be two from the Canterbury Regional Council, one from the Christchurch City Council, one from among Mackenzie, Waimate and Timaru District Councils, one from among Ashburton, Selwyn and Banks Peninsula District Councils and one from among Waimakariri, Hurunui and Kaikoura District Councils. If this proposed amendment was not support Mackenzie District Council supported the original Canterbury Waste Subcommittee resolution.

Committee members discussed the recommendation indicating support of more Councillor representation on the working party. The consensus was in favour of the Mackenzie District Council's proposal.

It was **resolved**:

1. That the Subcommittee adopt the amendment recommended by the Mackenzie District Council that the working party membership be two from the Canterbury Regional Council, one from the Christchurch City Council, one from among Mackenzie, Waimate and Timaru District Councils, one from among Ashburton, Selwyn and Banks Peninsula District Councils and one from among Waimakariri, Hurunui and Kaikoura District Councils.
2. That Councillor Stan Scorrige be the southern local authorities' representative.
