

4. CORRESPONDENCE

4.1 NEIGHBOURHOOD WEEK – 1-7 MARCH 1999, TE WHARE ROIMATA

The Board considered a report and photographs which had been forwarded from ICENG and Te Whare Roimata outlining the community barbeque jointly organised by these groups and the open day held at Te Whare Roimata. These events were supported by the Board from its discretionary fund.

4.2 LINWOOD HIGH SCHOOL

The Board considered a letter outlining details of the Linwood High School request for funding support for an exchange of students between Linwood High School and Twynham School, Christchurch, Dorset, as a millennium project.

4.3 TRANSITIONAL DISTRICT PLAN – HISTORIC BUILDINGS

A letter giving formal notice of the intention to demolish the Pyne Gould Guinness Grain and Wool Store Building in Moorhouse Avenue was before the Board. The protected feature of this building was the street facade. The letter advised that the required three months notice would expire on 6 July 1999 and that a photographic record of the building was being arranged.

The Board **decided:**

1. That the information be received.
2. That the Board write to Duncan Cotterill, Barristers & Solicitors, expressing the Board's concern that the Pyne Gould Guinness Grain and Wool Store building in Moorhouse Avenue is to be demolished and, while acknowledging that the Council can do very little about it under the City Plan, stating nevertheless that, in the Board's view, it is a matter of great regret that any heritage building be demolished.
