Corporate Plan Output: Transport Policy Advice	

The purpose of this report is to advise the Council that the Regional Land Transport Transport Vision Strategy was submitted to the Committee for review and to recommend changes to the Council's transport vision to reflect issues which are included in the Regional Land Transport Transport Review.

The officers of the Canterbury Regional Council have developed a draft vision for the Regional Land Transport Strategy Review, based on Canterbury Dialogues' transport vision and separate visioning work undertaken in rural areas of the Canterbury Region. The resulting transport vision which merged the urban and rural visions was discussed at the 10 November meeting of the Regional Land Transport Committee. The City Council has three representatives on that Committee: Councillors O'Rourke, Close and Crighton.

The Committee reviewed the content of both transport vision statements and has amended the transport vision adopted by the Council to reflect some issues which are included in the Regional Land Transport Transport Vision. The new version which is attached to this report is now recommended to the Council for adoption.

The Committee decided that the three Council representatives on the Regional Land Transport Committee be advised to neither vote for or against the adoption of the Regional Land Transport Strategy Transport Vision at the meeting on 10 November as some conflicts between both the regional vision and the metropolitan vision were noted. The Regional Land Transport Strategy Transport Vision is also attached for information.

- Recommendation:**
1. That the attached amended Metropolitan Christchurch Transport Strategy Vision Statement be adopted as the basis for the formation of the transport strategy for Christchurch.
  2. That it be noted that the amendments that have been made to the Council statement have taken account of the Regional Land Transport Strategy Vision Statement.
  3. That it be noted that there are some points of difference between the regional transport vision and the metropolitan Christchurch transport vision.
