- 2. That support for the provision of a right turn green arrow phase at the proposed traffic signals at the Main North Road/Johns Road intersection together with appropriate signage be conveyed to Transit New Zealand and further that an indication be sought as to the timing of the four laning of Johns Road/Russley Road.
- 3. That the Board endorses the approach being made by the Council to the Road Transport Forum asking for greater utilisation to be made of the outer ring road system (ie Johns Road/Russley Road).
- 4. That the Riccarton/Wigram Community Board's view be endorsed and that the Board (Fendalton/Waimairi) resolves similarly with regard to the Maidstone Road to Northcote Road section of the ring road route.
