

2. DEPUTATIONS BY APPOINTMENT

2.2 WAIWETU STREET

Jane Ellis, Chairperson of the Fendalton Open Air School's Board of Trustees, presented submissions detailing a number of concerns regarding the proposed upgrading of Waiwetu Street. Key issues related to traffic movement and the safety of the school children. The concerns included the earlier proposed dual cycleway/footpath, any reduction in the width of the road, the intended bollards on the east side of the road and the planned removal and/or access to grass verges. The provision of a designated pick-up zone was sought along with the provision of dedicated parking facilities at the school's Waiwetu Street entrance.

Mr Gray Ussher of 38 and 40 Waiwetu Street spoke on behalf of a number of street residents indicating support for the intended option 2 plan. He questioned the necessity for dedicated parking facilities at the school entrance and also queried the suggestion made of a restricted speed zone being applied in the street.

The Board **received** the submissions which were later considered in relation to clause 6, being the reports of the Board's Works and Traffic Safety Committee meetings of 18 and 21 July.
