22. COMMUNITY ADVOCATE'S UPDATE

22.1 CHRISTMAS BREAK – EMERGENCY DECISION-MAKING

The Board **resolved**:

- 1. That an emergency committee be delegated power to act to make emergency decisions on behalf of the Hagley/Ferrymead Community Board during the period from 28 November until seven days before the first scheduled meeting in 2001.
- 2. That the committee consist of the Chairperson plus any three available members of the Hagley/Ferrymead Board.

22.2 LYFE MURAL

This mural was painted in conjunction with the recent LYFE event in Linwood Park. Concern was expressed as to the quality of the art and how permanent the mural would be.

The Board **decided** to ask Art in Public Places for their definition of a temporary/permanent fixture, and also seek a way of consultation with Community Boards during the planning phase.

22.3 MEETING SCHEDULE FOR 2001

The Board **approved** the Hagley Ferrymead Community Board meeting schedule for 2001.

22.4 DISCRETIONARY EXENDITURE

The Board noted that a sum of \$29,630 remained available in the 2000/2001 discretionary fund for allocation

The Board **received** the information.

22.5 NEIGHBOURHOOD WEEK

The Board considered a report from the Neighbourhood Week Joint Board Committee held on 7 November 2000.

The Board **received** the information.

22.6 TE WHARE ROIMATA COMMUNITY GARDEN AT LINWOOD SERVICE CENTRE

The Board considered a proposal for Te Whare Roimata to use the currently vacant land behind the Linwood Service Centre as a community vegetable garden.

The Board **decided** to support this proposal and asked that the Property Unit be asked to draw up a formal licence agreement with Te Whare Roimata.

22.7 EVENTS STRATEGY POLICY

As part of the Events Strategy approved by the Council on 27 October 2000 and the subsequent establishment of a Festivals and Events Interim Advisory Board, the Council has now decided that the Advisory Board will comprise four City Councillors and four external members, and is actively seeking suitable people.

The Board **received** the information.

22.8 DRAFT POLICY TO REDUCE ALCOHOL-RELATED HARM AT PUBLIC EVENTS

The Board was asked to consider a proposed policy from the Parks and Recreation Committee, to reduce alcohol-related harm at public events from the Christchurch Safer Community Council.

The Board resolved that each Board member provide feedback on an individual basis.
