

12. DEPUTATIONS BY APPOINTMENT

(a) STREET NUMBERS ON STREET SIGNS

Mrs Denny Richardson, Christchurch Branch President, National Council of Women, was in attendance and sought the Council's support for the provision of street numbers on street signs particularly in the central business district. A provision for this work was deleted from the Annual Plan for 1999/2000. Mrs Richardson also requested that enforcement officers of the Council's Environmental Services Unit visit premises in the central city which are not displaying street numbers. She noted that many numbers are painted over or have been removed for renovations.

The Committee requested that reports on these issues be forwarded to the Committee by officers of the City Streets Unit and the Environmental Services Unit.

(b) NEW BRIGHTON MALL

Representatives of the New Brighton District Business Association, Mr M Munroe and Mr P Goosey, spoke in support of the reinstatement of the road through the Brighton Mall to Oram Avenue. The Committee noted that a working party chaired by Burwood/Pegasus Community Board Chair, Chrissie Williamson, had convened several meetings with the residents' groups and the New Brighton District Business Association. To date no agreement had been reached on the issues. The submissions from the New Brighton District Business Association were considered in association with clause 1 reported to the Council.
