

17. CHESTER STREET PEDESTRIAN MALL

The Board considered a report which discussed the submissions put forward by representatives of the Cathedral Grammar School at the 1 December 1999 meeting of the Community Board. These submissions proposed a joint use of the street in such a way that during school hours the use of the central section of the street would be restricted for use by pedestrians, thus extending the effective open space round the school buildings. Vehicle access would still be permitted at either end of the street during these periods. Outside school hours or hours to be determined, the road would function as a normal street. No restriction on the use of the street by pedestrians or cyclists was proposed.

The Board **resolved** to advise the Cathedral Grammar School that the Board supports the proposal to develop Chester Street as a pedestrian mall in principle, subject to the following conditions being met:

1. That the hours and periods during which the proposed pedestrian mall is to apply be defined.
2. That all costs be met by the Cathedral Grammar School.
3. That responsibility and arrangements for the day to day administration of any vehicle barriers be undertaken by the Cathedral Grammar School.
