16.5 CLEAN UP THE WORLD DAY – LINWOOD CEMETERY

The Board considered a letter from the Youth Co-ordinator of Our Youth, Our Community Charitable Trust thanking the Board for its support.

The Board **resolved**:

1. That the balance remaining of \$1680.20 be set aside and used for future clean up days at the cemeteries and for similar promotions of World Wetland Day (January 2001) and World Environment Day (June 2001) if appropriate.
2. That Jeff Macey, Youth Co-ordinator of Our Youth, Our Community Charitable Trust be written to and thanked for their help with the Clean Up the World Day.
3. That the Board allocate \$500 from the \$1680.20 balance set aside above to the Annual Gigantic Beach Clean Up (see clause 19 of this report).

16.6 FRIENDS OF EDMONDS FACTORY GARDEN – MUSICAL AFTERNOON AS PART OF HERITAGE WEEK

The Board considered a letter from the Secretary of the Friends of Edmonds Factory Garden seeking sponsorship of \$250 for a musical afternoon held in the garden on Sunday 15 October 2000 as a Heritage Week activity.

It was **resolved** that the Hagley/Ferrymead Community Board support the proposal that special historic area recognition be given by the New Zealand Historic Places Trust to the smaller area proposed and that the wider area proposed for this recognition be identified.

The Board **resolved**:

2. That a working party of Liz McRostie and John Freeman be asked to consider the Strategy and to make submissions on the Board's behalf.
