

19. CORRESPONDENCE

19.1 B PACIFIC BY US

The Board considered a written proposal for a youth programme to be run for two weeks during the September school holidays. The Burwood/Pegaus Community Board had already undertaken to contribute \$870.

The Board **resolved** to provide a grant of \$2,000 to B Pacific By Us from its 2000/2001 Discretionary Fund.

19.2 MT PLEASANT SCOUT DEN – BROKEN WINDOWS

The Board considered a request for funding of \$1700 to enable the Mt Pleasant Scout Group to replace the remaining 85 glass window panes in its building with polycarbonate in order to protect the building against vandalism.

The Board considered, as this was a Council-owned building, that replacing the glass windows with polycarbonate was a capital improvement which should be funded by the Property Unit. The Board left it to the Community Advocate to investigate this matter.

19.3 APPLICATION FOR FUNDING – GLENROY FAMILY CAMP

The Board considered a letter from Jeff Macey, Community Youth Worker of “Our Youth, Our Community” Trust seeking funding for a family camp to be held at Glenroy Lodge during the weekend of 27 to 29 October 2000.

The Board **resolved** to provide a grant of \$1800 from the 2000/01 Discretionary Fund to the “Our Youth, Our Community” Trust to assist with the Glenroy Lodge family camp during the weekend of 27 to 29 October 2000.

19.4 EDMONDS SMITH STREET KINDERGARTEN

The Board considered a letter from the Edmonds Smith Street Kindergarten seeking funding to enhance the play area at the kindergarten.

The Board **resolved** to provide a grant of \$2,000 from its 2000/01 Discretionary Fund to the Edmonds Smith Street kindergarten.

19.5 APPLICATION TO THE HAGLEY/FERRYMEAD COMMUNITY BOARD FOR FUNDING TO APPOINT PLANNERS

The Board considered a letter received from Belle Melzer, of the Inner City East Neighbourhood Group on behalf of ten Residents’ Associations and Neighbourhood Groups in the Inner City area seeking funding of \$3,000 to engage a professional planner to assist them in negotiations with the Council’s planners on City Plan issues which the group had referred to the Environment Court.

The Board **resolved** to allocate the sum of \$3,000 from its Strengthening Community Funds to the ten applicant groups, provided that:

- (a) The Council and the referrers agree upon the planner to be funded, and
- (b) That the planner is to be funded to assist the referrers in their negotiations with the Council.

Charles Manning retired from the meeting and took no part in the discussion and voting on this matter.
