4. TEESDALE STREET – PROPOSED GIVE WAY CONTROL

The purpose of this report is to seek the approval of the Council for the installation of a Give Way control against Teesdale Street at its intersection with Roydvale Avenue.

A paved threshold and narrowing in Teesdale Street at its intersection with Roydvale Avenue was proposed in the 2000/01 Capital Works Neighbourhood Improvement Programme. The previous Board resolved that the work be held over until the Living Streets workshop was held. After the workshop in May, the Area Engineer contacted the residents on all sides of the intersection to obtain their views on the proposed work. All residents expressed the opinion that they would like the physical layout of the intersection to remain as it is. Some residents thought that a Give Way restriction against Teesdale Street would be a satisfactory safety improvement.

The reallocation of the funds for the original project will be the subject of a separate report to the December meeting of the Board's Works, Traffic and Environment Committee.

Recommendation: That a Give Way control be placed against Teesdale Street at its intersection

with Roydvale Avenue.
