The purpose of this report is to gain final approval to site the Millennium Bridge at the daffodil woodland site and approval to fund the project according to the estimate and sourcing included in this report.

PROGRESS

At the Council meeting of 23 August 2001, the site was approved in principle and the project authorised to proceed, subject to funding.

The money set aside for lighting along Rolleston Avenue (\$133,000) is unlikely to be used this financial year and has already been carried over for two years. (This is not to be confused with a sum from the Community Trust, which is separate again.)

OUTSTANDING MATTERS

The Legal Services Manager is clarifying the copyright with the artist, through Art and Industry Biennial Trust. Once this has been settled, and the recommendations of this report are approved, an instruction can be given to the City Solutions Unit to draw up the contract documents, to progress the design and construction of the bridge.



Recommendation:

- 1. That the Millennium Bridge be sited across the Avon River in the daffodil woodland location.
- 2. That the funding be approved.
