

20. COMMUNITY ADVOCATE'S UPDATE

The Board considered a report from the Community Advocate regarding the following:

The Board received the information and **resolved**:

1. **Heritage Week**

That \$1,500 plus GST be allocated from the Board's 2001/02 Discretionary Funds to the Council's Communications Unit, to be applied towards the cost of Canterbury Television producing a 24 minute programme profiling Ngaio Marsh House, subject to:

- (i) Satisfactory arrangements being made for the use of the completed programme by interested parties.
- (ii) The presenter of the programme not being a politician.

That Sonia Gill and Oscar Alpers attend the Community Visioning workshop to be held in Christchurch on 18 September 2001, with the registration fees of \$400 plus GST being met from the Board's 2001/02 Discretionary Fund.
