

## 7. COMMUNITY BOARD OBJECTIVES, 2000/01 REVIEW

The Board was in receipt of the following schedule which reviewed the outcomes of the 2000/01 Board Objectives and Performance Indicators.

<p>2.2 Attend Riccarton, Hornby, Halswell, Broomfield and Youth liaison meetings as often as they are scheduled.</p> <p>2.3 Provide monthly opportunities for public participation in Board committee meetings.</p> <p>2.4 Hold one public meeting to invite participation in the annual plan process.</p> <p>2.5 Hold at least one public meeting per year per ward to seek community views.</p> <p>2.6 Proactively seek to attend at least two school cluster meetings.</p> <p>2.7 Support existing and encourage the formation of new residents' groups.</p>	<p>Advocacy team and elected members attend these forums on a regular basis.</p> <p>The Board continues to receive deputations to its monthly meetings as well as attendance at committee meetings.</p> <p>This was held on 31 August 2000.</p> <p>The Board did not schedule any ward based meetings.</p> <p>The Community Advocate, on behalf of the Board, has attended school cluster meetings.</p> <p>The Board continues a very constructive with its resident groups and new ones have been set up at Awatea and Wigram. Informal resident groups exist in other areas eg Avonhead/Ilam.</p>

<p>8 To improve the natural and built neighbourhood environment in Riccarton/Wigram</p> <p>8.1 Meet with appropriate business units of Council and Canterbury Regional Council on regular basis to discuss issues of mutual interest and concern, eg natural resources, policy issues.</p>	<p>The Committee has met with Parks and Waterways Unit for “talkfeasts” and on-site inspections during the period under review. Advocated examples include Kyle Park redevelopment, waterway land purchase, Port Hills land acquisition, Nga Puna Wai Reserve redevelopment.</p> <p>Meeting with Environment Canterbury, also, on their Annual Plan, and specific issues such as private pit compliance, air quality (eg Feltex Carpets) etc.</p>
<p>8.2 Advocate for increased funding for the implementation of Neighbourhood Improvement Plans and Local Area Traffic Management Schemes.</p>	<p>The Board, through the Works and Traffic and this Committee, have followed through on this performance indicator. Advocated examples include the Blenheim Road deviation, southern motorway designation retention.</p> <p>The first “living street” project for Christchurch, being Peverel Street is the best example of this performance indicator being achieved (it received an award from Creative NZ).</p>
<p>8.3 Improvement to the streetscape environment by advocating for at least six tree planting programmes in the Riccarton/Wigram ward.</p> <p>8.4 Address the (identified) shortfall in green open spaces in the Riccarton ward.</p> <p>8.5 Continue a programme of park enhancement by initiating and funding at least one active/recreational and/or landscape improvement project per ward.</p> <p>8.6 Fostering Christchurch’s Garden City image through hosting a Community Pride Award presentation function for the Riccarton/Wigram recipients.</p>	<p>The following streets were planted</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Showgate Avenue</li> <li>- Peverel Street (Euston to Wainui)</li> <li>- Azalea Close</li> <li>- Bella Rose Drive</li> <li>- Springs Road (Gibson to Halswell Junction)</li> <li>- Wycola Avenue</li> <li>- Kumai Place</li> <li>- Van Dieman Close</li> <li>- Bowen Street</li> </ul> <p>The Committee has supported the purchase and development of both the Hillary Crescent and Picton Avenue sites.</p> <p>The Committee has provided funds, to complement the Parks Unit capital works programme.
