## 5. WASTE REDUCTION GOALS

To consider the following motion, notice of which has been given by Councillor Anna Crighton and the eight other Councillors listed below, pursuant to Standing Order 2.18.14:

- "1. That the Christchurch City Council confirm its support for the retention of the existing waste reduction goals contained in the solid and hazardous waste management plan of 1998, providing (inter alia) for a reduction in the rate per person of solid waste going to the landfill of 100% by the year 2020 or by the time the new regional landfill is filled.
- 2. That the Council therefore revoke the public notification given on Saturday 24 March 2001, giving notice of the Council's intention to amend, by way of the special consultative procedure, parts of the solid and hazardous waste management plan of 1998 to adopt the following revised targets, as set out in the supplementary report by the Chairman of the City Services Committee submitted to the 22 March Council meeting:
  - (a) Zero waste to landfill as soon as possible, taking into account social, legal and economic constraints.
  - (b) A minimum reduction by 50% of the volume of waste to landfill from 2000 to 2020.
- 3. That interested parties who have made submissions on the proposed alteration to the waste reduction goals be advised that the Council now proposes to seek adherence to the existing solid waste reduction goals set out in the solid and hazardous waste management plan of 1998.
- 4. That the subcommittee comprising Councillors O'Rourke, Thompson and Wells appointed at the March Council meeting to consider the public submissions on the proposed changes to the SHWMP and report directly to the May Council meeting thereon be discharged, and that the subcommittee's report to the present Council meeting be received."
