

### 3. PARTICIPATION – UPDATE ON ARTS PROJECTS AND ACTIVITIES

The Committee received a report from Marlene Le Cren, Arts Adviser updating the Council on the following projects and activities relating to the arts:

- Landscaping of corner of Lincoln Road and Lyttelton Street, and installation of a Llew Summers sculpture 'the Wave'
- Dance and drama courses for third age participants
- Creative communities funding
- Remembering Diana – a concert in the Cathedral
- Creative New Zealand – creative places awards 2002
- 'Joy of Eternal Spring' – sculpture by Llew Summers, Ensors Road, Charleston
- Update from Artworks in Public Places Subcommittee meeting Friday 2 August 2002

The Committed **decided** to:

1. Receive the information.
2. Approve the Artworks in Public Places Subcommittee's recommendation:
  - (1) That David Marshall (Artist) be commissioned to produce 3 bronze corgi dogs under the supervision of Stephen Glesson, subject to the availability of funding.
  - (2) That the costs of one bronze corgi dog plus installation, be purchased through the Artworks in Public Places budget, with sponsorship meeting the costs of the remaining two bronze corgi dogs. (Note: A report on funding to be presented to the next meeting of the Subcommittee.)
  - (3) That once funding has been secured a contract be finalised between the artist (David Marshall) and the Council.
