

## 4. DEPUTATIONS BY APPOINTMENT

### 4.2 Dianne Monk

Dianne Monk a resident of McCormacks Bay addressed the Board expressing her concern about the McCormacks Bay intersection and the Main Road, Redcliffs.

She noted that the area needed some respite from the traffic build-up. Debris often obstructs the footpath in the vicinity of the bus terminal at No 150 McCormacks Bay. In her view the area also needs to be surveyed for establishing yellow lines for parking. This is especially critical where the No 32 bus travels. Consideration also needs to be given to extending the Balmoral Lane entrance across to the Causeway, creating a parking area and safe walkways.

She raised issues about street cleaning and the maintenance of bus stops.

Dianne Monk advised that there is no sign or pedestrian crossing outside Mt Pleasant School. Safety should be a priority. She also noted that it would be useful to have signs on rubbish bins to say that they are not for household rubbish which is causing them to overflow.

Traffic is also travelling at speed around McCormacks Bay cutting a corner trying to escape the traffic flow from Sumner.

The Board **decided** to refer the issues of the maintenance of the street cleaning contract and maintenance of bus stops to its Works and Traffic Committee.

The Board were advised that a survey on traffic flows from Sumner will be completed in the first half of 2002.
