NOTICES OF MOTION

1. PROPOSED CITY PRODUCE MARKET, SPECIAL ORDER DECLARING CAMBRIDGE TERRACE BETWEEN COLOMBO STREET AND MANCHESTER STREET AS PART-TIME PEDESTRIAN MALL

Following further discussions with the parties involved, it has been decided to recommence the Special Order procedure to allow further time for interested parties to lodge objections to the proposal, and to allow time for the Hearings Panel to consider and report to the Council on those objections.

The Council is therefore requested to consider the adoption of the following motion:

- "1. That pursuant to section 336 of the Local Government Act 1974, the Christchurch City Council resolves by Special Order, that Cambridge Terrace, between Colombo Street and Manchester Street, as shown on the plan attached, be declared a pedestrian mall.
- 2. That the driving, riding or parking of any vehicle or the riding of any animal be prohibited between the hours of 3am Saturday to 2am Monday subject to the following exceptions and conditions:
 - (a) Trade and other vehicles associated with the operation of a street market and associated activities may enter the mall at specified times if authorised by the licensee of the street market.
 - (b) Street cleaning and rubbish collection vehicles operated by the Christchurch City Council or its nominated contractor may enter the mall at any time.
 - (c) Any vehicle or specified class of vehicle that has entered the mall under any section of this special order must not be parked for a longer period than is necessary for its driver to carry out his or her business or for the period of any emergency.
 - (d) Nothing in this Special Order shall be deemed to prohibit or restrict the use of the mall by any police, fire appliance, ambulance or other vehicle where it is necessary for that appliance or ambulance or other vehicle to enter the mall or portion thereof for the protection of human life or property.
- 3. That the Council delegate generally to the Council Hearings Panel the power to hear objections pursuant to Section 336 of the Local Government Act 1974 and to make a recommendation to the Council.
- 4. That the Council Secretary be authorised to give the required public notice that clauses 1 and 2 of the foregoing motion will be submitted to the Council at its meeting on Thursday 22 August 2002, for confirmation by way of Special Order."

Assuming that the Council adopts the foregoing motion, it is anticipated that the objections received to date and any further objections will be heard by the Council's Hearings Panel on or about Monday 19 August, to allow the Hearings Panel to report to the 22 August Council meeting regarding the confirmation or otherwise of the foregoing Special Order resolution.
