

4. SOCIAL INITIATIVES FUNDS

The Committee considered social initiatives funding decisions for 9 community projects for the year ending 30 June 2002.

At its 6 August 2001 meeting the Community Services Committee reviewed its commitment to all the currently funded projects. It allocated one year's social initiatives funding (2001/02 year) to the following community organisations with specific conditions set before any ongoing funding would be considered.

The Committee also noted that one of its outcomes over the next year was to undertake a funding review to address the ways in which the Council delivers funding for the voluntary sector through a range of funding streams. The Social Initiatives Fund would be part of that review.

The Committee **decided** that the following social initiatives funding allocations would be made, subject to annual evaluations as follows:

| Out of School Programmes Funding Support Project | Providing the objectives of the community organisations receiving social initiatives funding continue to meet the criteria and priorities of the Social Initiatives Fund, the \$50,000 per year support for OSP continues year by year under its present CCC administration and Community Committee allocation of funds structure. |
| Parafed Canterbury | 2 years (1 July 2002-30 June 2004) \$16,500 per year |
| GAIN Canterbury | 2 years (1 July 2002-30 June 2004) \$28,000 per year subject to two conditions as outlined in the agenda |
| Canterbury Mental Health Education and Resource Centre Trust | 2 years (1 July 2002-30 June 2004) \$17,000 per year |
| Te Kaupapa Whakaora Trust - Youth Community Projects | 2 years (1 July 2002-30 June 2004) \$25,000 per year |

The Committee considered applications for social initiatives funding from Early Start Project Ltd and Family Help Trust and agreed to defer decisions on these applications pending the consideration of additional financial information. This information was not available at the time of preparing the Council agenda and the Chairman has proposed that the applications be reconsidered at the next Community and Leisure Committee meeting on Monday 10 June 2002.
