8. RICCARTON/WIGRAM TRANSPORT AND ROADING COMMITTEE REPORT OF 7 NOVEMBER 2003 MEETING

The Board considered the report of the Transport and Roading Committee meeting of Friday 7 November 2003.

The Committee received reports on the City Streets Kerb and Channel Replacement Prioritisation Process, and the proposed changes to speed limits.

The Committee agreed to circulate a proposal to place a pedestrian island on Waterloo Road, on the road frontage outside Hornby High School.

A request to place no parking restrictions on Chalmers Street was held over as the Committee expressed some concerns about this project not being part of a report on the wider implications of the Mall extensions and its impact on traffic movements and volumes.

A request to support the installation of a school patrol at Gilberthorpe School was also discussed. The Board's recommendation regarding this request is recorded in clause 1 of this report.

The Board **decided** to advise the Sustainable Transport and Utilities Committee that it supported the following projects proceeding to final design, tender and construction:

- Cashmere Road/Hendersons Road intersection improvements
- Springs Road traffic safety improvements

In respect of the Clyde Road (Riccarton Road to Creyke Road) kerb and channel renewal and traffic management project, the Board considered that a further resolution was required (recorded below) but agreed that the balance of the work should proceed.

Accordingly, in respect of Clyde Road, the Board decided:

- 1. That approval be granted for the Clyde Road kerb and channel/traffic management project to proceed to final design, tender and construction.
- 2. That further consideration be given to the possible widening and/or implementation of other traffic safety improvement measures in Clyde Road should complaints regarding traffic safety and/or accidents in Clyde Road be received in the future.
- 3. That parking options for the northern side of Clyde Road, between Kirkwood Avenue and Okeover Stream, be developed for the next Transport and Roading Committee meeting.
