


1. DEPUTATIONS BY APPOINTMENT

(a) Sarah Sutcliffe and Adrienne Burgess, Styx Residents Group



Adrienne and Sarah spoke to the Board requesting a footpath be installed along Cavendish Road, from Styx Mill Road intersection to the existing footpath at the Sturrocks Road intersection. Adrienne advised that many pedestrians use Cavendish Road to reach school or to travel to and from the Styx Mill Reserve.

The Information Manager, City Streets, advised that the speed limit on Cavendish Road would be lowered from 80km to 70km, and that there was a walkway through Regents Park to Barnes Road. However this area would be reconsidered given the current development on Cavendish Road.

The Chairperson asked that staff investigate the mounded dirt on Cavendish Road. She also requested staff investigate the 1989 Environment Court decision and conditions on the development of Cavendish Road.

The Chairperson asked that staff report back to the Board on the Residents' Group request, and that the installation of a footpath on Cavendish Road be recommended to the Annual Plan Subcommittee.

(b) John Knox and Anne Carroll, Catchment Management Conference

John Knox thanked the Board for providing funding for him to attend the Catchment Management Conference in Hamilton. John spoke to the Board about what occurred at the conference including talks by community groups, field trips to a polluted lake and a walkway installation and speakers on waterway quality. John suggested that the Council should maintain a record of scientific data such as water quality.

Anne Carroll found the conference interesting and noted the energy and passion of the people involved in the various projects, and the partnerships they had formed to care for their local environments.

The Chairperson requested a report from Environment Canterbury on water quality at the Groynes.
