

#### 4. DEPUTATIONS BY APPOINTMENT

##### 4.1 CANTERBURY SPORTS MANAGEMENT COLLEGE

Dr SukBo Hong, John Yoon and Paul Moon from the Canterbury Sports Management College addressed the Committee about their proposal to establish an international tertiary training institution adjacent to QEII.

They spoke of why they had chosen Christchurch, the difficulties in establishing such an institution in Korea and the benefits for QEII Park and Christchurch.

The information was **received** and a recommendation is recorded in clause 3 of this report.

##### 4.2 QEII ICE STADIUM TRUST

Ray Maclean and Ross Maguire from the QEII Ice Stadium Trust addressed the Committee about their proposal to build a new Olympic-sized ice arena adjacent to QEII.

The Ice Stadium Trust was formed in 2001 by people interested in ice sports. The Trust commissioned a feasibility study for the proposal. The Trust has received support from various ice sports represented in Canterbury for a new facility.

The information was **received** and a recommendation is recorded in clause 1 of this report.

##### 4.3 SAFER CHRISTCHURCH

Yvonne Palmer from Safer Christchurch addressed the Committee and provided an update on Safer Christchurch. The Crime Prevention Unit put out a discussion document earlier in 2003 about future models for safer communities. It is expected that the future direction will be known by the end of September. Safer Christchurch identified three projects that the Crime Prevention Unit is currently funding in Christchurch: Pathway to Offending, Girls at Risk and the bus exchange. Yvonne Palmer agreed to keep the Community and Leisure Committee informed of progress with Safer Christchurch.
