

## 5. REPORT ON THE DISESTABLISHMENT OF THE ART IN PUBLIC PLACES SUBCOMMITTEE

A report from the Urban Development Policy Leader and Team Leader Leisure Planning outlined the remaining work programmes and activities from the disestablished Art in Public Places Subcommittee, and recommended possible next steps.

The Committee **resolved**:

1. That in the future staff report on the outstanding issues and projects listed in the report and their respective development directly to the Arts, Culture and Heritage Committee.
2. That the Arts, Culture and Heritage Committee convene an unpaid Art in Public Places Working Party to be partially constituted by some interested members of the disbanded Art in Public Places Subcommittee, and:
  - (a) That this Working Party be convened approximately every two months or as needs arise in providing advice on art in public places;
  - (b) That it have input into the development of the Art in Public Places Operational Procedures; and
  - (c) That adequate staff resources be identified and provided to support the Working Party and its activities.
3. That staff investigate the development of a policy that requires all Council units to allocate a percentage of each capital works budget item towards public art elements.
