

MAKING OF CHRISTCHURCH CITY TRAFFIC AND PARKING ALTERATION BYLAW 2001

The Christchurch City Council, at an ordinary meeting held in the Civic Offices, 163 Tuam Street, Christchurch at 2pm on Thursday 24 May 2001, passed the following resolution:

"That in pursuance of the powers vested in it by the Local Government Act 1974, the Christchurch City Council makes the Christchurch City Traffic and Parking Alteration Bylaw 2001".

The principal purposes of the bylaw are to:

- Prohibit the use of specified roads by certain classes of vehicles, during the hours specified in the draft bylaw.
- Prohibit the operation of a motor vehicle weighing less than 3,500 kilograms on any part of a road in such a manner as to cause the vehicle to undergo sustained loss of traction by one or more of the driving wheels of the motor vehicle.
- Prohibit the wilful application of petrol, oil, diesel or any liquid on to a road to be used by a motor vehicle to undergo sustained loss of traction by one or more of the driving wheels of the motor vehicle.

The bylaw is proposed to come into operation on 9 July 2001.
