SCARBOROUGH HILL RESERVE CONSERVATION MANAGEMENT PROPOSED GRAZING LICENCE

Scarborough Hill Reserve is a recreation reserve administered by the Council under the provisions of the Reserves Act 1977. The reserve is bounded by Evans Pass Road and lies north and south of the Summit Road adjoining Godley Head reserve to the east. As part of the Port Hills Reserves, this reserve is managed primarily for conservation of indigenous grass species, recreation and visual values. To avoid further deterioration of indigenous vegetation the Council intends to use grazing as a conservation management tool, primarily to conserve the ecological values of the tussock grassland.

This is public notice that the council intends pursuant to Section 74 (2) (a) of the Reserves Act 1977, to grant a conservation grazing licence for part of Scarborough Hill Reserve (as described in the Schedule below) for a maximum period of 5 years. Subject to the Reserves Act notification procedures confirming the grant, the grazing licence will be tendered.
