PROPOSED CHRISTCHURCH DISTRICT PLAN AS AMENDED BY BANKS PENINSULA DISTRICT COUNCIL DECISION ON ITS DESIGNATIONS

Notice is hereby given that Banks Peninsula District Council has made its decision confirming the existing BPDC designations with the exception of one site where the designation is no longer required. The decision amends some of the conditions the designations are subject to. From the date of this notice, the Proposed Plan is deemed to have been amended in accordance with this decision.

REMOVAL OF PART OF REQUIREMENT FOR "POLICE" DESIGNATION, NAYLAND STREET

The Minister of Police has advised the Christchurch City Council that he no longer requires part of the "Police" designation requirement included in the Christchurch Proposed City Plan over the land at 55-57 Nayland Street.

The area not required is described as Lot 2 DP 308800 and covers approximately 590 m2. The underlying zoning of the property is Living 3. The relevant part of the designation requirement is now removed.
