

PROPOSED REVOCATION OF SPECIAL ORDER DECLARING A PEDESTRIAN MALL BETWEEN SEAVIEW ROAD AND ORAM AVENUE

The Christchurch City Council, at an ordinary meeting held in the Civic Offices, 163 Tuam Street, Christchurch commencing at 2pm on Thursday 24 April 2003, adopted the following resolution:

'That in pursuance of the powers vested in it by the Local Government Act 1974, the Council commence the Special Order procedure to revoke the 1978 Special Order declaring a pedestrian mall in New Brighton, in respect of that part of the mall between Seaview Road and Oram Avenue.'

The purpose of the resolution is to provide for the inclusion of a slow road through the affected area as part of the New Brighton Master Plan, which has received overwhelming support from the New Brighton community.

The installation of the slow road in conjunction with a number of other initiatives in the roading network around central New Brighton will represent a significant contribution towards the New Brighton Revitalisation Project.
